The Guide to the Exhibition of Zdeněk Rossmann

The *Horizons of Modernism* exhibition is divided into six basic sections mapping out Rossmann's stages in the geographical centres where he created his cardinal works. His stage designs have been singled out as an independent theme, and the wartime and post-war stages have been summed up under the title Epilogues.

The creative output of the architect Zdeněk Rossmann is typified by his penchant for technology in his solutions. Examples are shown throughout the whole scope of the design areas in which he worked: architectural plans, stage design drawings, maps, graphs and guidebooks.

To navigate through the *Horizons of Modernism* exhibition you have available the *Guide to the Exhibition* of *Zdeněk Rossmann* that will take you through six exhibition units:

- 1. Rossmann and Interwar Brno
- 2. Rossmann at the Bauhaus and in Paris
- 3. Rossmann and Zlín
- 4. Stage Design
- 5. Rossmann and Slovakia
- 6. Epilogues

The primary inspiration for creating the guide to the showcase in a "Rossmann" spirit was provided to the exhibition's graphic designer Robert Vojtěch Novák through a photograph from the installation of the exhibition of László Moholy-Nagy at the Brno Künstlerhaus (today the Brno House of Arts) from 1935 (in Bratislava it was installed by Zdeněk Rossmann), which he found in a book by Oliver A. Botar Sensing the Future: Moholy-Nagy, Media and the Arts. The Brno reprise of the exhibition of László Moholy-Nagy was installed by Rossmann's friend and another figurehead of the Brno avantgarde, František Kalivoda, who made the arrangements for Zdeněk Rossman to bring the exhibition to Bratislava. The photographs from the exhibition (stored in the architectural collection of the Brno City Museum) clearly show that the exhibits were displayed without captions, instead being marked with a numbered disc only referring to the title or a more detailed description. The graphic design for the Guide to the Exhibition of Zdeněk Rosmann reflects a similar approach and at the same time accommodates practical requirements: many of the Czech-English descriptions would exceed or equal in format the dimensions of Rossmann's subtle exhibits.
